Epwell Parish Council Meeting – 13th January 2025

These are notes only. For full details, please see EPC board and village website.

PROVISIONAL DATES FOR MEETINGS THIS YEAR:

March 24th, May 15th – Thursday, July 14th, September 8th, November 10th.

(All meetings are on Monday, apart from May, when the two Bank Holidays complicate things).

One member of the public attended.

Public participation: Village website. Currently the website has 3 administrators and it was suggested that one of them should be a member of EPC. This will be sorted accordingly

Collapsed corner of building opposite village hall: There have been concerns voiced over the stability of the corner of the barn. Highways came out and stabilised the building, and put barriers and warning signs around the area. The electricity wires have also been sheathed. This is all in preparation for repair work, which will take place in two or three weeks, once the weather improves.

Highways:

- Flooding down by the green. Thames Water have carried out a repair on a pipe that was cracked by Voneus.
- The second flooding has yet to be sorted investigations are ongoing.
- A new 'grip' has been created down by the Mill to alleviate flooding at the corner.
- EPC would like to encourage people to report potholes on Fixmystreet.com. It does get results.
- A resident has offered to spread salt in the village. The correct salt will have to be purchased.
- Silver birch. OCC to be contacted about concerns as to the siting of this tree, which they planted.
- The Thames valley sewage pump failed in the recent rain, but has now been fixed.
- The stream on Cranes Farm lower field has now been cleared, which should help the water flow more easily.

Defibrillator/CPR training: There have been requests for training to show how the village defib works. EPC is arranging an evening in February: Wednesday 26th in the village hall, 7 – 9pm. Please contact Nicola Rudge if you would like to come along as we need to have an idea of numbers. The training will be done by Andrew McEwan from Shutford. He has already run courses in 3 local villages and is keen to cover more areas.

Advance notice: The Annual Parish meeting will be on Thursday May 15th. This is not a parish council meeting; it is a chance for village organisations to give an update on their status and progress. Everyone in the village is invited to attend – you never know, you might learn something new about your village!




Book Reviews by Clare Lee

The Ghost Ship by Kate Mosse



A swashbuckling ride upon the high seas with the latest generation of Mosse's Huguenot family attempting to escape persecution in France. This is the third in the Joubert trilogy and the writing is as precise and exciting as ever. It is a tale of adventure and buccaneering, love and revenge, stolen fortunes, piracy and hidden secrets on the high seas. The surprising heroine fulfils her childhood dream of taking command of a ship, but not just any ship, one that through science applied to look like magic, attacks the slaver vessels along the Barbary coast forcing them to ply their trade elsewhere. Mosse is always meticulous in her research and this novel concerns a time period not often written about. The characters are strong, with dangerous secrets to hide, and the sense of living in France as an outsider adds to the atmosphere and tension in the story.

The Clues in the Fjord by Sato Ramu



Hildur Rúnarsdottir is the only detective in the Westfjords, Iceland's most sparsely populated region. Her new partner is Jakob, a police trainee on secondment from Finland, has chosen the remote internship in part to escape his own issues. When what initially appears to be an avalanche victim turns out to have been murdered, the region's reputation as a crime backwater changes. Other bodies turn up, both locally and in the capital Reykjavik and it soon becomes apparent the victims are linked, but how? Family trees become an intrinsic tool for investigators, and even in such a small, close-knit community, there are still surprises around lineage.

The Templar Secret by Scott Mariani



I remain unsure whether I want to include this book with its guns and battles, wrecked cars and a hero who seems immortal due to his own highly honed skills, but it is a good story. So, suspending disbelief and skipping over the sections where the gun battles or incredible driving skills are described in way too much detail, this book explores the power of religious tensions. The narrative explores why seeing a set of symbols scratched on the wall of a crypt in southern France leads to a car chase resulting in the death of a close friend of the hero Ben Hope. Ben is faced with uncovering a mystery that may strike at the heart of Western civilisation, and which just might be the one secret that could take him down.

New York Salad recipe contributed by Matthew Platt

Inspired by some fantastic quality pastrami from Tysoe Stores - thick tender slices, nice and pink.

Start with a generous quantity of freshly washed and spun rocket or watercress (or both), seasoned with a pinch of salt and pepper.

Add big chunks of the pastrami, fresh parmesan shavings cut with a potato peeler and blobs of mustard mayonnaise one part French's American mustard to three parts Hellmans.

Just before serving, top each plate with a freshly poached egg, cutting into the runny yolk completes the dressing and elevates this simple salad to a delicious new level.






